CALL FOR APPLICATIONS – JOINT ACADEMIC POSITIONS

The Institute of Philosophy (IP) and the Institute for Sustainable Development (IDS) of the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile (PUC), invite interested candidates to apply for a full-time joint position as either Assistant or Associate Professor. The position is in the areas of intergenerational justice, justice and biodiversity, sustainable development, philosophy of wellbeing, demographic justice, and others, and starts in January 2024. The successful candidate is expected to conduct teaching and research in some of these fields.

The appointment requires the selected candidate to have half of the workload in each of the two units, both in their teaching, research, and service work. The chosen candidate should maintain a balance regarding the contribution to both units.

The IP is one of the leading research institutions in Latin America with a strong undergraduate and postgraduate program. The IDS is an interdisciplinary academic unit that seeks to cross-section the issues of sustainability and sustainable development in collaboration with organizations outside the University.

The ideal candidate should have:

- A strong academic background in Philosophy at the undergraduate and-or graduate levels.
- A Ph.D. degree by the beginning of the appointment.
- A demonstrated capacity to develop and communicate high-quality research and a good record of publications (for candidates applying to Associate Professor).
- Commitment to excellence in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, as well as student supervision and support.
- Capacity and willingness to work collaboratively and engage in activities that show good citizenship.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- PhD by the beginning of the appointment.
- Proficiency in Spanish.
- Familiarity with, and appreciation of, the principles and mission of the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile.

APPLICATION MATERIALS (IN EITHER SPANISH OR ENGLISH)

- Cover letter (highlighting publications, grants, undergraduate and graduate teaching, conference participation and organization, professional service).
- Research statement (describing current and proposed research in the field of medieval philosophy of 3 pages in length).
- Curriculum Vitae, organized in the following format:
 - i. Personal information: name, address, phone number, e-mail address and webpage (if applicable).
 - ii. Education: list of academic and professional degrees, indicating the granting institutions and relevant dates. Academic degree certificates must be attached.)
 - iii. Research:
 - a. Full list of publications (WOS, SCOPUS, and others), book chapters, and books. Among them, highlight the most relevant(s) and their impact in the fields of this call.
 - b. Participation in research projects, explaining level of participation (PI, Co-I, other), dates, and institution.
 - c. Teaching experience, indicating the institution, course, and participation (responsible, co-responsible, etc.).
 - d. Other: awards, language proficiency, or other information considered relevant to the application.
- Copy of the PhD degree.
- 2 or 3 reference letters.
- 1 or 2 selected research articles, with a brief indication of the main contribution to the discipline that supports their selection.

Selected candidates should be available to give a mock class and to participate in an interview with the Selection Committee.

If a non-Chilean citizen, the successful candidate will need to obtain the appropriate visa from the corresponding Chilean consulate to become a faculty member.
